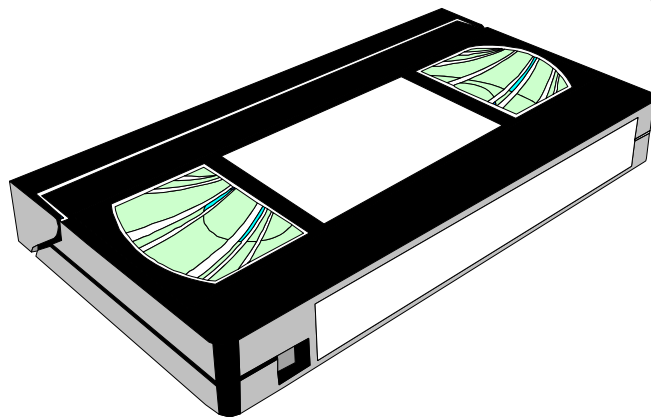

However, there is still death and injury on our roadways and this film-to-video brings the message home in dramatic fashion.</i>  |
| <b>Video #194</b> | <b>One for Over the Line</b><br><i>A crash scene is shown after a teen party and heavy drinking. It’s a multiple crash with fatalities and serious injuries. A driver is arrested and charged with DUI. We watch the aftermath played out in details of agony and remorse.</i>   |
