**BloodBorne Pathogens Exposure Control for Healthcare Facilities, OSHA 7200  
(certificate series course)**

The purpose of this one-day course is to develop a Bloodborne Pathogens Exposure Plan for healthcare facilities using a step-by-step approach. The target audience is the program administrator, manager, or other personnel designated with the responsibility of developing a Bloodborne Pathogens Exposure Control Plan for a small healthcare facility.

**Update for General Industry Outreach Trainers, OSHA 503**  
This course is designed for personnel in the private sector who have completed the OSHA 501 instructor course in Occupational Safety and Health Standards for the General Industry and who are authorized trainers in the OSHA Outreach Training Program. It provides an update on such topics as OSHA general industry standards, policies and regulations.

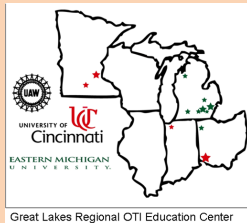
**June 15—18, 2010**

**Environmental Safety / Universal Waste Regulations**

What is Universal Waste Regulations? --- These regulations have streamlined hazardous waste management standards for the federal universal wastes (batteries, pesticides, thermostats, and lamps). The regulations govern the collection and management of these widely generated wastes. This facilitates the environmentally-sound collection and increases the proper recycling or treatment of the universal wastes mentioned above.

These regulations also ease the regulatory burden on retail stores and others that wish to collect or generate these wastes. In addition, they also facilitate programs developed to reduce the quantity of these wastes going to municipal solid waste landfills or combustors. It also assures that the wastes subject to this system will go to appropriate treatment or recycling facilities pursuant to the full hazardous waste regulatory controls.

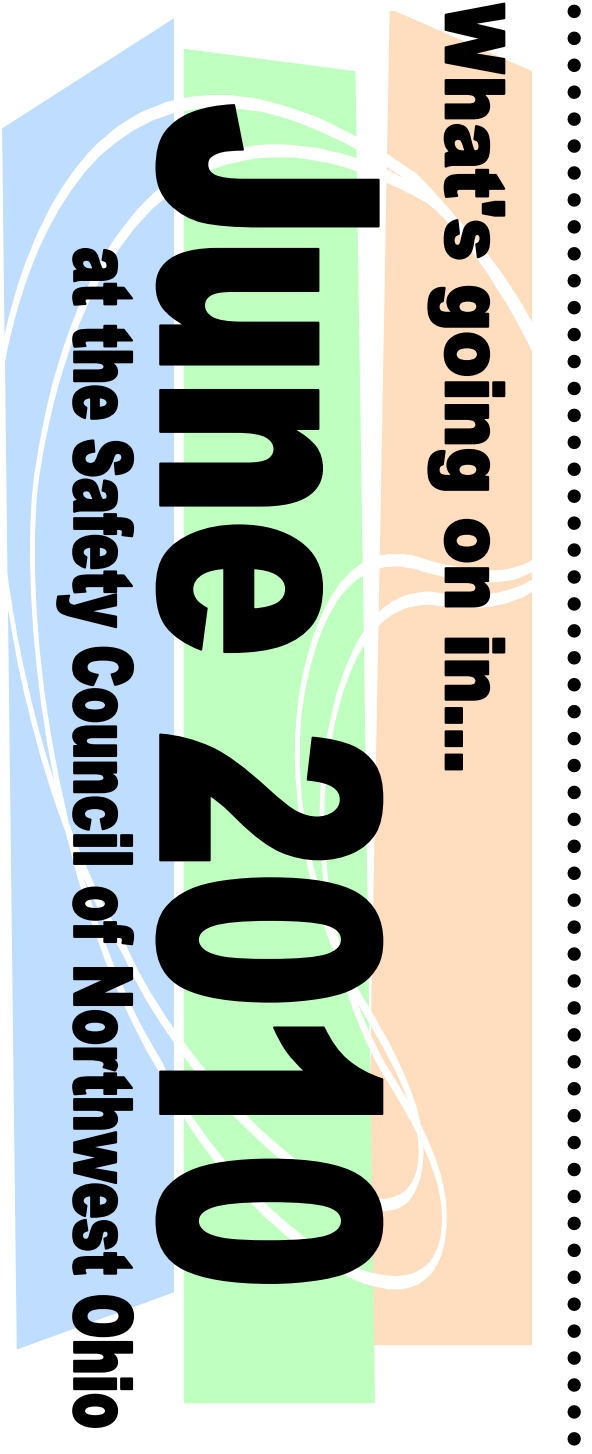
